The SASAS award is to be given to an individual in recognition of research, education or technical achievement in any of SASAS fields. . The award is in the form of a medallion and a diploma. Nominations are considered by the SASAS medal Committee which makes recommendations for final approval by SASAS Council. Individual considered does not necessarily have to be member of SASAS

Nomination Process and Requirements for SASAS medal

The nominator is responsible for sending the entire nomination package to the SASAS medal Committee chairman, Prof Willem Landman. **The awards require the following: nomination letter, citation, nominee Curriculum Vitae (two pages), bibliography and two letters of support**

The SASAS medal Committee has the responsibility to select and submit to the Council the names of individual(s) recommended for this award. **All nominations should be submitted by 15 August 2016.** The nominees for most awards remain on the committee's active list for three years. They will be allowed to update an unsuccessful nomination at the beginning of the next award cycle.

What You Need to send to Willem Landman (Willem.Landman@up.ac.za)

- Nominating letter – up to two pages
- Two supporting letters – up to two pages each
- Citation – 50 words or less
- CV – up to two pages **No more**
- Bibliography

What is an Award Citation?

In 50 words or less, the citation should reflect the nominee's accomplishments, as it relates to his nomination for that particular award. It generally sums up what is in the nomination letter.
