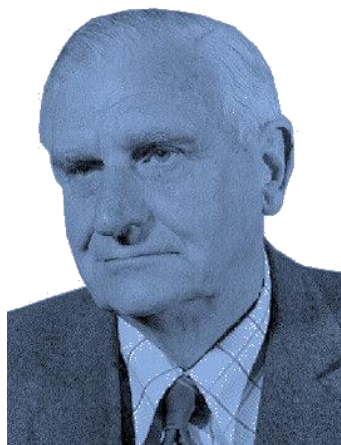


# Stanley Jackson Award

## 2016



Stanley P. Jackson (1905-2002) was committed to science and education in South Africa. Most of his scientific career was spent at WITS where he established meteorology and climatology. However, he made friends in meteorology worldwide. He is perhaps best known for the *Climatological Atlas of Africa* or so-called "Jackson's atlas" which was published in 1961. SASAS decided to name the prestigious award for an exceptional paper after Stanley Jackson.

**SASAS members are hereby invited to submit papers for consideration for the Stanley Jackson Award (SJA)**

Submissions of journal papers are welcomed and may include the following:

➤ **Applied research**

The research results of the paper should have clear application in Southern Africa in order to enhance atmospheric science and oceanography. The results should find application in other related research fields or have societal or economic benefits. The benefits may be immediate or through on-going research.

➤ **Fundamental or theoretical research**

The research results should be innovative and unique in technique or rationale or the paper should show unique application of existing methodology.

Guidelines for submissions

- Submission are accepted from paid up SASAS members
- All submission should be done on-line <http://goo.gl/forms/Qc3X6Ynt648TWrQs1> by **19 August 2016**. After completing the form e-mail your paper to [sasocatmsci@gmail.com](mailto:sasocatmsci@gmail.com)
- Only one submission per main author
- A paper may only be submitted for consideration once
- Only peer reviewed papers from scientific journals relating to the atmosphere and ocean may be submitted
- Only papers which have appeared in journals in two calendar years prior to the annual SASAS conference may be submitted. (Papers from 2014, 2015 and 2016 will be considered for the 2016 SJA)

Guidelines for awarding of the SJA

- Papers will be reviewed by an independent panel consisting of at least 5 members.
- Only one SJA is awarded annually and is presented at the annual SASAS conference.
- The award consists of a certificate as well as a cash prize of R 3000.
